Nahum: The Book of Nineveh Destroyed

I. The History Behind Nahum

- A. <u>ABOUT 120</u> years had passed since Jonah led a revival in Nineveh, Assyria's capital.
- B. During that time, <u>ISRAEL</u> was exiled by the Assyrians in 722 BC.
- C. God showed <u>MERCY</u> to Israel by allowing them to be scattered by a less cruel king.

II. The Destruction of Nineveh is Decreed (Nahum 1).

- A. Nahum was not asking for repentance but declaring divine <u>JUDGMENT</u> on Assyria.
- B. Nahum, whose name means "<u>COMFORT</u>," comforted and consoled Judah.

III. The Destruction of Nineveh is Described (Nahum 2).

- A. Nahum said the <u>CONQUERORS</u> of Nineveh would treat them as they treated others.
- B. Nahum announced that Nineveh would be defeated by <u>FLOOD</u>, fire, and sword.

IV. The Destruction of Nineveh is Deserved (Nahum 3).

- A. Nahum stated the reasons for their annihilation: They were arrogant, wicked idolaters.
- B. Nahum assured the people of Judah that Assyria's end was <u>INEVITABLE</u>.

Habakkuk: The Book of Faith Tested

 I. Faith Questioning: Habakkuk's Burden (Habakkuk 1) A. Habakkuk's first question: <u>HOW LONG</u> will wickedness last? (Why aren't you doing something, God?)

- B. God's answer:
 - 1. I am doing something you would not <u>BELIEVE</u>.
 - 2. I am raising up the <u>CHALDEANS</u> to judge my people.

C. Habakkuk thought about the character of God.

1. God is everlasting and HOLY.

DEFINITION OF FAITH - HBOs

HEAR the Word	Romans 10:17
BELIEVE the Word	Romans 4:20
OBEY the Word	Hebrews 11:8
Without <u>SEEING</u>	Hebrews 11:1

- God has appointed the Chaldeans to <u>CORRECT</u> Judah.
- 3. God's eyes are too <u>PURE</u> to look on wickedness.
- D. Habakkuk's second question: <u>WHY</u> would God use the Chaldeans to judge when they are worse than those being judged? (Why are You doing that?)

II. Faith Listening: Habakkuk's Vision (Habakkuk 2)

- A. Habakkuk: I will watch and <u>WAIT</u> for God to speak.
- B. God's answer:
 - 1. The righteous will live by his <u>FAITH</u>.
 - 2. The proud one is never <u>SATISFIED</u>.
 - 3. The Lord is in His temple; be <u>SILENT</u> before him.
 - 4. The earth will be filled with the knowledge of the <u>GLORY</u> of the Lord.

III. Faith Responding: Habakkuk's Prayer (Habakkuk 3)

A. A Prayer of Petition: Lord, in Your wrath, be <u>MERCIFUL</u>.

- B. Pray of Praise: He remembered God's past works to <u>SAVE</u>.
- C. Prayer of Faith:
 - 1. I will trust God regardless of my <u>CIRCUMSTANCES</u>.

 The Lord will be my <u>STRENGTH</u>.
 He will make my feet like hind's feet...steady and <u>SURE</u>.

Zephaniah The Book of Judah Warned



Zephaniah: Book of Judah Warned

I. Introduction to the Book of Zephaniah

- A. Under evil Manasseh and Amon, Judah sank into idol worship and depravity.
- B. Amon's son Josiah was put on the throne at the age of eight.
- C. It was during this time that God called Zephaniah to speak His words.
- D. Zephaniah was of royal blood and a man of authority.

Zephaniah: Book of Judah Warned

II. Look Within: Future Judgment for Judah (Zephaniah 1:1-2:3)

- A. God will remove all things (physical life).
 - 1. He will remove MAN first.
 - 2. He will remove the **BEASTS**.
 - 3. He will remove the **BIRDS**.
 - 4. He will remove the <u>FISH</u>.

- B. God will cut off the spiritual adulterers (spiritual life).
 - 1. He will cut off the <u>IDOL</u> worshipers.
 - 2. He will punish those who practice <u>ASTROLOGY</u>.
 - 3. He will cut off the <u>DOUBLE</u> minded.
 - He will cut off those who <u>USED</u> to worship God but do not any longer.
 - 5. He will cut off those who worship <u>SELF</u>.

- C. God will punish their sin (specific sins).
 - 1. He will punish those who look to the <u>WORLD</u>.
 - 2. He will punish those who are idol worshipers or those who <u>STEAL</u>.
 - 3. He will punish those who are <u>VIOLENT</u>.
 - 4. He will punish those who are <u>DECEITFUL</u>.
 - 5. He will punish those who are <u>STAGNANT</u> in spirit.

D. The Day of the Lord will be wrath.

- 1. There will be <u>TROUBLE</u> and distress.
- 2. There will be destruction and **DESOLATION**.
- 3. There will be <u>DARKNESS</u> and gloom.
- 4. There will be trumpet and <u>BATTLE</u> cry.
- 5. The world will be devoured in the fire of His <u>JEALOUSY</u>.

- E. God exhorted Judah to repent.
 - 1. He told them to <u>SEEK</u> the Lord.
 - 2. He told them to seek <u>RIGHTEOUSNESS</u>.
 - 3. He told them to seek <u>HUMILITY</u>.
 - If they did, they might be <u>HIDDEN</u> in the day of the Lord's anger.

III. Look Around: Future Judgment for the Nations (Zephaniah 2:4-3:8)

A. God will judge:

- 1. PHILISTIA (West)
- 2. MOAB (East)
- 3. ETHIOPIA (South)
- 4. ASSYRIA (North)

- B. God will surely judge Jerusalem.
 - 1. They were <u>REBELLIOUS</u>.
 - 2. They did not <u>TRUST</u> God.
 - 3. They did not draw near to GOD.

Zephaniah: Book of Judah Warned

IV. Look Beyond: Future Blessings for Jews (Judah) and Gentiles (Nations) (Zephaniah 3:9-20)

A. There will be blessings for the Gentiles.

- 1. All of them will have <u>PURIFIED</u> lips.
- 2. All of them may call on the <u>NAME</u> of the Lord.
- 3. They will serve God <u>SHOULDER</u> to shoulder.

- B. There will be blessings for the Jews.
 - 1. They will feel no <u>SHAME</u>.
 - 2. They will never again be <u>HAUGHTY</u>.
 - 3. They will take <u>REFUGE</u> in the Lord.

C. There will be blessings from God.
1. The LORD will be in their midst.
2. He will EXALT over them with joy.
3. He will be QUIET in His love for them.
4. He will <u>REJOICE</u> over them with shouts of joy.

Haggai

The Book of Temple Finished



 I. Haggai's First Message: False Priorities (Haggai 1:1-15)

- A. The remnant was reprimanded for its <u>MISPLACED</u> priorities (Haggai 1:1-6).
- B. Haggai gave the remnant God's <u>REMEDY</u> for quitting (Haggai 1:7-8).
 - 1. Consider your <u>WAYS</u>!
 - 2. Get back to work and FINISH the temple.

II. Haggai's Second Message: False Comparison (Haggai 2:1-9)

- A. God talked to those who remembered the former temple and were <u>COMPARING</u> it (Haggai 2:1-3).
- B. Haggai encouraged the remnant by prophesying that <u>CHRIST</u> would occupy the temple they were completing (Haggai 2:4-9).

III. Haggai's Third Message: False Assumption (Haggai 2:10-19)

- A. A question regarding <u>DEFILEMENT</u> vs. <u>HOLINESS</u> was asked of the priests (Haggai 2:10-13).
- B. Haggai confronted the "resting" remnant with its uncleanness and explained that its <u>SUFFERING</u> was because of it (Haggai 2:14-19).

IV. Haggai's Fourth Message: False Fear (Haggai 2:20-23) A. There would be <u>PUNISHMENT</u> for their enemies (Haggai 2:20-22).
 God would:

1. <u>SHAKE</u> the heavens and the earth.

- 2. <u>DESTROY</u> weapons and armies.
- 3. OVERTHROW thrones and kingdoms.
- 4. Israel would be VICTORIOUS.

B. There would be <u>PROTECTION</u> for God's children (Haggai 2:23).

Zechariah

Zechariah: Book of Future Built

I. Zechariah's Eight Visions

- A. The first five visions were of <u>COMFORT</u> for Jerusalem.
 - 1. The horsemen and myrtles meant that God would <u>REBUILD</u> Zion and the people.
 - 2. The four horns and craftsmen meant that Judah's oppressors would be <u>JUDGED</u>.
 - 3. The man and the measuring line meant that God would be the <u>WALL</u> of Jerusalem.

- The cleansing of Joshua, the high priest, pointed to the future <u>RESTORATION</u> of Israel.
- 5. The golden lampstand represented God's <u>EMPOWERING</u> of Zerubbabel, the governor.

- B. The last three visions were of <u>JUDGMENT</u>.
 - The flying scroll meant that individual sins would be <u>JUDGED</u>.
 - 2. The woman in the basket represented the nation's sins being <u>REMOVED</u>.
 - 3. The four chariots represented God's <u>JUDGMENT</u> descending on the nations.

The crowning of Joshua foretold the coming of the Branch, who would reign as the High Priest and the King!

II. Zechariah's Four Messages

- A. The first message was a rebuke of empty <u>RITUALISM</u>.
- B. The second message was a reminder of past <u>DISOBEDIENCE</u>.
- C. The third message was one of <u>RESTORATION</u> and consolation of Judah (Israel).
- D. The final message was of the return of <u>JOY</u> and hope to the kingdom.

III. Zechariah's Two Burdens

- A. The first burden was the <u>FIRST</u> Advent of Christ.
 - Jerusalem would be spared and <u>PRESERVED</u> for her king's arrival (Alexander the Great).
 - 2. Israel would <u>SUCCEED</u> against Greece (the Maccabees).
 - 3. Israel would <u>REJECT</u> her Shepherd-King and be led astray by false shepherds.
 - 4. The people would be <u>SCATTERED</u>.

- B. The second burden was the <u>SECOND</u> Advent of Christ.
 - All of the nations of earth will attack Jerusalem, but her Messiah will <u>PROTECT</u> and deliver her.
 - 2. The Messiah will come in power to <u>RULE</u> and judge the whole earth from Jerusalem.

Malachi

The Book of Final Message Given



Malachi: The Book of Final Message Given

I. Problems of the Priests: God's Accusations (Malachi 1:1-2:9)

A. God said, "I have loved you," but they asked, "<u>HOW</u>?"

- 1. The evidence: I <u>CHOSE</u> you.
- B. God said, "You are despising my <u>NAME</u>," but they asked "<u>HOW</u>?"
 - 1. The evidence:
 - a. You bring blind, lame, sick <u>SACRIFICES</u>.
 - b. You say how <u>TIRESOME</u> it is to make sacrifices.

c. You bring what was taken by <u>ROBBERY</u>.
d. You don't keep your <u>VOWS</u> (your word).
2. The consequence: I will send a <u>CURSE</u> upon you.

C. God said, "You have corrupted the <u>COVENANT</u> of Levi."

- 1. The evidence: You have turned aside from the way and caused many to <u>STUMBLE</u>.
- 2. The consequence: I have made you <u>DESPISED</u> before all people.

II. Problems of the People (Malachi 2:10-3:8)

A. God said, "You have broken the <u>CONVENANT</u> of our fathers."

- 1. The evidence:
 - a. You deal treacherously with your <u>BROTHER</u>.
 - b. You deal treacherously with the LORD.
 - c. You deal treacherously with your <u>WIFE</u>.

- Three covenants the people have broken:
- 1) Covenant of Levi
- 2) Covenant of the fathers at Mount Sinai
- 3) Covenant of marriage
 - B. God said, "You are <u>ROBBING</u> Me," but they asked, "<u>HOW</u>?"
 - The evidence: You rob God in <u>TITHES</u> and offerings.

III. Promises of the Lord (Malachi 3:1-4:6)

- A. God said, "I will send My <u>MESSENGER</u> to clear the way before Me" (John the Baptist).
- B. God said, "The messenger of the <u>COVENANT</u> will come" (Jesus).
 - 1. He is coming to <u>PURIFY</u> Israel.
 - 2. He is coming to JUDGE Israel.
 - 3. God said, "<u>RETURN</u> to Me and I will return to you," but they asked, "<u>HOW</u>?"
