The Book of God's
Righteousness Described



I. Man's Sin: The Need for God's Righteousness (Romans 1-3:20)

- A. The gospel reveals the <u>RIGHTEOUSNESS</u> of God.
- B. The gospel also reveals the <u>WRATH</u> of God against sin.
- C. God revealed himself to man through CREATION. (Gentiles are without excuse.)

- 1. Man exchanged the <u>GLORY</u> of God for the glory of man.
- 2. Man exchanged TRUTH for a lie.
- 3. Man exchanged <u>NATURAL</u> sex for unnatural.
- D. God revealed Himself in the <u>LAW</u>, but man broke it. (Jews are without excuse.)
- E. God's conclusion is that <u>NO ONE</u> is righteous.

II. God's Salvation: The Explanation of Righteousness (Romans 3:21-8)

- A. Justification is a legal term meaning "to <u>DECLARE</u> righteous."
- B. We are justified by <u>FAITH</u> in Jesus apart from works.
- C. Abraham was justified when he <u>BELIEVED</u> God, and God added righteousness to his account.
- D. Justification means to make <u>PEACE</u> with God (past).

- E. Glorification means to be <u>PRESENT</u> with God (future).
- F. Sanctification means to develop the CHARACTER of God (present).
- G. Justification requires the <u>DEATH</u> of Jesus. Sanctification requires the <u>LIFE</u> of Jesus.
- H. Paul said there are three laws:

- 1. The law of GOD.
- 2. The law of SIN.
- 3. The law of the **SPIRIT**.

III. Man's Responsibility: The Jews' Relationship to Righteousness (Romans 9-11)

- A. God chose Israel, but only a remnant of Israel CHOSE God.
- B. Israel pursued righteousness by <u>WORKS</u> and stumbled.
- C. There is no distinction between Jew and Gentile. Whoever will <u>CALL</u> on the name of the Lord will be saved.
- D. God is not finished with Israel, for His <u>CALLING</u> is irrevocable.

IV. God's Will: The Application of Righteousness (Romans 12-16)

- A. Present your <u>BODY</u> to God as a living sacrifice.
- B. Be at PEACE with all men.
- C. Be in SUBJECTION to authorities.
- D. Make no provision for the <u>FLESH</u> in regard to its lusts.
- E. Don't JUDGE your brother.
- F. SERVE and love your brother.

1 Corinthians

The Book of Church's Problems Corrected



I. Paul and the Corinthian Church

A. The History of Corinth

- 1. The Corinthians worshiped Aphrodite, the goddess of <u>LOVE</u>.
 - a. The temple boasted <u>ONE THOUSAND</u> consecrated prostitutes.
 - b. "To act like a Corinthian" symbolized gross <u>IMMORALITY</u>.

B. Paul and the Church in Corinth

- 1. Paul established the church on his <u>SECOND</u> missionary journey (See Acts 18:1-18).
- 2. He wrote this letter to the church on this THIRD missionary journey when he was in Ephesus.

II. Paul's Answer to Chloe's People's Report (1 Corinthians 1:10-4:21)

- A. There were divisions caused by <u>SELF-EXALTATION</u>.
 - 1. They did not understand the work of the CROSS.
 - 2. They did not understand the work of the HOLY SPIRIT.

- B. There were consequences for their lack of understanding.
 - 1. They would not grow **SPIRITUALLY**.
 - 2. They would lose eternal REWARDS.

III. Paul's Answer to an Anonymous Report (1 Corinthians 5-6)

- A. Gross sexual <u>IMMORALITY</u> should not be tolerated.
 - 1. Remove the offender from the CHURCH.
 - 2. Do not associate with immoral BELIEVERS.
- B. Christians should not **SUE** Christians.

- C. Sexually immoral people will not inherit the <u>KINGDOM</u> of God.
 - 1. Our bodies are temples of the HOLY SPIRIT.
 - 2. Our bodies are to bring GLORY to God.

IV. Paul's Answers to Questions Raised in a Letter (1 Corinthians 7-16)

- A. Paul addressed confusion concerning MARRIAGE.
 - 1. Married couples should not <u>DENY</u> one another sexually.
 - 2. A believing spouse should not <u>DIVORCE</u> because of his or her mate's unbelief.
 - 3. Singleness allows greater freedom for Christian <u>SERVICE</u>.

- B. Paul addressed confusion concerning <u>FOODS</u> consecrated to pagan gods.
 - 1. Do nothing that causes your weaker brother to <u>STUMBLE</u>.
 - 2. Exercise SELF-CONTROL in all things.

- C. Paul addressed confusion concerning SPIRITUAL GIFTS.
 - 1. Spiritual gifts are for the common <u>GOOD</u> of the church.
 - 2. LOVE is superior to all gifts.
 - 3. God's definition of <u>LOVE</u> is found in 1 Corinthians 13:4-7.

- D. Paul addressed confusion concerning the <u>RESURRETION</u>.
 - 1. If Christ has not been raised, then our faith is <u>WORTHLESS</u>.
 - 2. We will have bodies that are IMPERISHABLE.
 - 3. Christ's resurrection was witnessed by <u>FIVE</u> <u>HUNDRED</u> people.

4. At the last trumpet, the dead will be raised, and the living in Christ will be CHANGED.

2 Corinthians

The Book of Paul's Ministry Defended



2 Corinthians: The Book of Paul's Ministry Defended

I. Paul Defended his Ministry by Explaining His Actions (2 Corinthians 1-7).

- A. Believers were greeted with teaching on God's <u>COMFORT</u> (2 Corinthians 1:3-6).
 - 1. <u>STRENGTHEN</u>, encourage, and teach them during trials.
 - 2. Help others who were suffering when SHARED.

- B. Paul explained his itinerary <u>CHANGES</u> and sought their understanding (2 Corinthians 1:12-2:13).
- C. Various important spiritual <u>TRUTHS</u> were shared (2 Corinthians 2:14-7:16).
 - 1. Believers are both a sweet <u>FRAGRANCE</u> of victory and a foul smell of death.
 - 2. Their changed <u>HEARTS</u> were proof of Paul's ministry.

- 3. Paul preached God's <u>GRACE</u> and the Christlike transformation that results.
- 4. Believers are God's <u>VESSELS</u> used to preach Christ.
- 5. Believers are told to "not lose HEART."

- 6. <u>NOW</u> is the time for salvation, so conduct yourselves accordingly.
 - a. Be equally **YOKED**.
 - b. Be PURE (holy).
 - c. Be <u>REPENTANT</u> rather than merely sorrowful.

II. Paul Challenged the Corinthians to Generous Giving (2 Corinthians 8-9).

- A. The Philippians' <u>COLLECTION</u> for the Jerusalem saints was praised (2 Corinthians 8:1-6).
- B. The Corinthian church should <u>SUPPORT</u> kingdom work by giving (2 Corinthians 8:7-9:15).
- C. Paul shared principles and promises regarding <u>GIVING</u> (2 Corinthians 8:16-9:5).

III. Accusations Against Paul's Authority Were Answered (2 Corinthians 10-13).

- A. Paul denied false <u>CHARGES</u> (2 Corinthians 10).
- B. Paul defended his <u>APOSTLESHIP</u> with proof of his authority (2 Corinthians 11:1-12:13).
- C. Paul announced his future plans to <u>VISIT</u> Corinth (2 Corinthians 13:1-14).

Galatians

The Book of Believers' Freedom in Christ



Galatians: The Book of Believers' Freedom in Christ

 Paul's Gospel of Grace is Defended (Galatians 1-2).

- A. Paul greeted the Galatians with the gospel of GRACE and peace and then cursed those who preached a <u>DISTORTED</u> gospel.
- B. Paul gave his biographical history to defend his <u>APOSTLESHIP</u> to the Galatians.
- C. Paul reminded the Galatians of the <u>AUTHORITY</u> of the gospel of grace and that it was <u>APPROVED</u> by the council in Jerusalem.

D. Paul referred to correcting Cephas (Peter) on the matter of <u>FREEDOM</u> in Christ.

Galatians: The Book of Believers' Freedom in Christ

Paul's Gospel of Grace is Defined (Galatians 3-4).

- A. The Galatians were given the Holy Spirit by <u>FAITH</u>, not by <u>WORKS</u>.
- B. The Galatians were justified by <u>FAITH</u>, not by <u>WORKS</u>, just as Abraham was.
- C. The <u>LAW</u> was given to draw men to faith, not to <u>SAVE</u> them.
- D. The Galatians were adopted <u>SONS</u> of God and no longer <u>SLAVES</u> to the law.

- E. The Galatians needed to regain their freedom and blessings by <u>FAITH</u>, not by the <u>LAW</u>.
- F. The sons of Abraham represented the <u>SLAVE</u> <u>SHIP</u> of the law versus the <u>FREEDOM</u> of the promise examples: Sarah and Isaac, Hagar and Ishmael.

Galatians: The Book of Believers' Freedom in Christ

III. Paul's Gospel of Grace is Applied (Galatians 5-6).

- A. Paul sought to help the Galatians <u>RECLAIM</u> their position and practice of <u>LIBERTY</u>.
- B. Paul explained that the principles of <u>LAW</u> and <u>LIBERTY</u> are opposite.
- C. Paul told the Galatians that the power of LIBERTY is found in the HOLY SPIRIT.
- D. Paul reminded the Galatians that they are LIBERATED to do good.

Ephesians

The Book of Believers' Holy Walk



Ephesians: The Book of Believers' Holy Walk

I. Our Calling: What God Has Done – Past (Ephesians 1-3)

- A. We are rich with all heavenly blessings when we are <u>IN</u> Christ.
 - 1. The Father <u>CALLED</u> us in Him to be holy and blameless.
 - 2. The Son <u>REDEEMED</u> us through His blood. He forgave our sins.
 - 3. The Holy Spirit <u>SEALED</u> us in Him, guaranteeing an inheritance.

- B. Before we were in Christ, we <u>WALKED</u> according to the world, the flesh and the Devil.
- C. Now Christ has <u>SEATED</u> us with Him in heavenly places.
 - 1. We are not saved by our works but <u>FOR</u> good works.
 - 2. Seated in Christ we are to <u>WALK</u> in His good works.

- D. Christ called Jews and Gentiles into one BODY.
 - 1. The church demonstrates to angels the WISDOM of God.
 - 2. The church demonstrates to people the <u>POWER</u> of God.

Philippians

The Book of Believers' Joy in Christ



Philippians: The Book of Believers' Joy in Christ

I. The History of the Church in Philippi

- A. The History of Philippi
 - 1. Philippi was a ROMAN colony.
 - 2. This small city was an important military outpost in <u>MACEDONIA</u>.
 - 3. The citizens had the same special privileges as the <u>ROMAN</u> citizens.

- B. Paul and the Church in Philippi
 - 1. Paul founded the church on his <u>SECOND</u> missionary journey in AD 51 (see Acts 16:11-40).
 - 2. Some of Paul's early converts included a wealthy woman merchant, a jailor, and a <u>SLAVE</u> girl.
 - 3. Paul wrote this letter to the Philippian church during his first IMPRISONMENT in Rome in AD 62 (see Acts 21-28).

4. Philippians is Paul's most PERSONAL letter.

Philippians: The Book of Believers' Joy in Christ

II. The Letter to the Philippians

- A. Christ is our <u>LIFE</u>: "To live is Christ" (Philippians 1).
 - 1. The believer should have the same AFFECTIONS as Christ.
 - 2. The believer should have the same RESPONSE to circumstances as Christ.
 - 3. The believer should have the <u>SPIRIT</u> of Christ.
 - 4. The believer should have the <u>CONDUCT</u> of Christ.

- B. Christ is our <u>ATTITUDE</u>: "Have this attitude in ourselves which was also in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 2).
 - 1. The believer should have the <u>HUMILITY</u> of Christ.
 - 2. We should regard others as more important than <u>OURSELVES</u>.
 - 3. Christ's obedience is our MODEL.

- 4. Do all things without **GRUMBLING**.
- 5. Hold fast to the WORD of life.
- C. Christ is our <u>GOAL</u>: "I have suffered the loss of all things and count them but rubbish so that I may gain Christ" (Philippians 3).
 - 1. The believer's goal is to KNOW Christ intimately.

- D. Christ is our <u>STRENGTH</u>: "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me" (Philippians 4).
 - 1. Christ is the believer's JOY.
 - 2. Christ is the believer's <u>PEACE</u>.
 - 3. Christ is the believer's SATISFACTION.
 - 4. Chris is the believer's STRENGTH.

Colossians

The Book of Believers'

Colossians: The Book of Believers' Completion in Christ

I. Christ's Supremacy Was Proven Through His Person and Work (Colossians 1:1-23).

- A. Paul greeted the Colossian believers first with words of <u>PRAISE</u>.
- B. Paul revealed the <u>PRAYER</u> he and coworkers in Rome had prayed for them.
- C. Paul revealed Christ's CHARACTER.
 - 1. He is the visible <u>IMAGE</u> of the invisible God.
 - 2. He is the FIRSTBORN of all creation.

- 3. All things were <u>CREATED</u> by Christ and for Christ.
- 4. He is <u>BEFORE</u> all things, and because of Him all things <u>HOLD</u> together.
- 5. He is the <u>HEAD</u> of the church (body).
- 6. He is the beginning, the firstborn of the <u>DEAD</u>.
- 7. He is to have first place in **EVERYTHING**.

- 8. The full **ESSENCE** of God dwells in Him.
- 9. He <u>RECONCILES</u> all things to Himself through His death.
- 10.His <u>DEATH</u> made them holy, blameless, and presentable to God.

Colossians: The Book of Believers' Completion in Christ

II. Christ's Supremacy Was Witnessed Through His Church (Colossians 1:24-2:7).

- A. Paul's purpose was to reveal the <u>MYSTERY</u> hidden for ages.
- B. Paul wanted the Colossians to understand that faith in Christ makes all believers <u>FAMILY</u>.
- C. True wisdom and knowledge would prevent their being led astray by false teaching and persuasive <u>ARGUMENTS</u>.
- D. Paul wanted the Colossians, having begun in Christ and now growing in Him, to <u>WALK</u> accordingly.

Colossians: The Book of Believers' Completion in Christ

III. Christ's Supremacy Was Revealed Through Religious Teachings (Colossians 2:8-23).

- A. Paul warned of being enslaved to worldly PHILOSOPHIES and empty deceptions.
- B. Christ's teaching is superior to:
 - 1. <u>LEGALISM</u>, which is being enslaved to the law.
 - 2. Mystic insights and the worship of ANGELS.
 - 3. <u>ASCETCISM</u>, which is self-neglect, self-denial, and self-abuse for religious purposes.

Colossians: The Book of Believers' Completion in Christ

IV. Christ's Supremacy Was Revealed Through Practical Experience (Colossians 3-4).

- A. Believers were to set their minds on things ABOVE, not things on earth.
- B. Believers were <u>DEAD</u> to certain accepted worldly actions.
- C. Behavior within the <u>FAMILY</u> and between masters and slaves is God's plan.
- D. Believers were encouraged to devote themselves to PRAYER.

- E. Instructions for being a Christian <u>WITNESS</u> were given.
- F. Paul ended with a request to be <u>REMEMBERED</u>.

1 Thessalonians

The Book of Return of the Lord



1 Thessalonians: The Book of Return of the Lord

I. Paul's Personal Reflections to the Thessalonians (1 Thessalonians 1-3)

- A. Paul offered congratulations for their <u>FAITHFULNESS</u>.
- B. Paul reminisced about <u>FOUNDING</u> the church.
- C. Paul commended Timothy for STRENGTHENING the church.

1 Thessalonians: The Book of Return of the Lord

II. Paul's Practical Exhortations To The Thessalonians (1 Thessalonians 4)

- A. Paul encouraged them to <u>WALK</u> in a manner worthy of God.
- B. Paul gave them directions for their spiritual GROWTH.
- C. Paul gave a revelation concerning the <u>DEAD</u> in Christ.

1 Thessalonians: The Book of Return of the Lord

III. Paul's Description of the Return of the Lord to the Thessalonians (1 Thessalonians 5)

- A. Paul admonished them to wait and <u>WATCH</u> for the glorious presence of the Lord.
- B. Paul prayed that they would be blameless and <u>HOLY</u> when the Lord returns with His holy ones.
- C. Paul warned them that the Lord's return will be <u>SUDDEN</u>, audible, and visible.

2 Thessalonians

The Book of Day of the Lord



2 Thessalonians: The Book of Day of the Lord

I. Persecution Before the Day of the Lord (2 Thessalonians 2)

- A. Paul commended the Thessalonians for enduring persecution and <u>AFFLICTION</u>.
- B. Paul comforted the Thessalonians by saying Jesus is coming again.
 - 1. For the believer, He is coming to <u>RELIEVE</u> affliction.
 - 2. For the unbeliever, he is coming to deal out eternal <u>DESTRUCTION</u> and separation from His presence.

2 Thessalonians: The Book of Day of the Lord

II. Misunderstanding About the Day of the Lord (2 Thessalonians 2)

- A. Three events or signs must take place before the Day of the Lord comes.
 - 1. APOSTASY must come first.
 - 2. The MAN of lawlessness will be revealed.
 - 3. He who <u>RESTRAINS</u> will be taken out of the way.
- B. Apostasy means a <u>FALLING AWAY</u> or departing from the faith.

- C. The man of lawlessness will <u>SIT</u> in the temple as if he were God.
 - 1. He will have the power to perform MIRACLES.
 - 2. He is probably the one called the <u>ANTICHRIST</u>.
 - 3. He will wage war with the <u>SAINTS</u> for three and a half years (see Daniel 7:21-25; Revelation 13).

- D. He who restrains is probably the HOLY SPIRIT.
 - 1. God promised that the Holy Spirit will never be taken away (see John 14:16-17)
 - 2. The restrainer of sin will be taken <u>OUT</u> of the way.

2 Thessalonians: The Book of Day of the Lord

III. Behavior in Light of the Day of the Lord (2 Thessalonians 3)

- A. Paul asked the Thessalonians to <u>STAND</u> firm on the Word of God.
- B. He asked them to <u>PRAY</u> for him and that the Word would spread.
- C. Paul commanded them to <u>WORK</u> until Jesus comes.
