Questions with answers:

1. During what Feast in Jerusalem did Jesus declare Himself the Light of the World?

The Feast of Booths or the Feast of Tabernacles (John 7:2 John 8:12)

2. At this point in Jesus' ministry, the Jews had tried to stone Him, and the religious leaders had tried to seize Him. Why did they not succeed?

God is sovereign. He prevented their killing Him because it was not yet Jesus' time to die or the means of His death. (John 7:30 John 8:20)

3. Name three ways Jesus described His relationship with the Father. (several answers from John 8:21-30 John 8:39-50)

The Father is always with Jesus. They have the same mind. They have the same heart. To know One is to know the Other. Jesus always does the will of the Father. Jesus speaks the word of the Father. Jesus has come from God. The Father sent Him. Jesus honors His Father.

4. How many disciples/missionaries did Jesus send out as "lambs in the midst of wolves" instructing them to carry no money, bag, or shoes?

Seventy (Luke 10:1-4)

5. Jesus pronounced "Woes" on which three cities? (Luke 10:13-15)

Chorazin Bethsaida Capernaum He pronounced woe on them because they had seen many miracles and not believed.

6. After telling the parable of the Good Samaritan, Jesus asked the lawyer who "proved to be the neighbor to the man who fell into the robbers' hands?" How did the lawyer respond?

"The one who showed mercy toward him." (Luke 10:36, 37)

7. To whom did Jesus say "you are worried and bothered about so many things;"?

Martha (Luke 10:41)

8. Where did the religious leaders say Jesus got His power to cast out demons?

Beelzebul (Luke 11:15)

9. Name three "woes" Jesus pronounced "woes" onto the Pharisees and lawyers. Why did He do this? (several answers from Luke 11:42-52)

They tithed herbs but disregarded justice and the love of God. They loved the chief seats in the synagogues. They love respectful greetings in the marketplace. They were like concealed tombs. They weighed men down with burdens but wouldn't lift a finger to help. They build the tombs of the prophets and their fathers killed them. They will kill prophets and apostles too. They have taken away the key of knowledge.

10. Why were the Pharisees angry with Jesus for healing the woman bent over for 18 years, the man born blind, and the man with dropsy?

He healed them on the Sabbath (Luke 13:10-14, John 9, Luke 14:1-6)

11. To what two common items did Jesus compare the kingdom of heaven? (Luke 13:18-21)

Mustard seed—starts tiny, grows large Leaven—small, silently grows, raises the entire lump of dough

12. What reason did Jesus give His disciples for the man being born blind in John 9?

"It was neither that this man sinned, nor his parents; but it was so that the works of God might be displayed in him." (John 9:3)

13. What did Jesus say was the difference between Himself as the Good Shepherd, and the religious leaders – the "hired hands"? (John 10:11-18)

Jesus lays down His life for the sheep. The hired hands see the wolf coming and run, leaving the sheep. The hired hands are not concerned with the sheep.

14. In the parable of the man giving a big dinner party, who does the host invite after receiving excuses from the original guests? (Luke 14:16-24)

"The poor and crippled and blind and lame"

15. To be a disciple/follower of Jesus, what must you carry? (Luke 14:27)

Your own cross

16. To illustrate the joy in heaven over sinners being saved, Jesus describes what three lost items? (Luke 15:3-32)

Sheep Coin Prodigal Son

17. Jesus says you cannot serve two masters. Who are the two masters? (Luke 16:13)

God and wealth

18. After Jesus healed ten lepers on the road to Jerusalem, which of them returned and why? (Luke 17:11-19)

One—a Samaritan—returned to thank Him, worship Him and to express his faith in Him.

19. Why did the rich young ruler not follow Jesus? (Matthew 19:16-22)

Possible answers: His heart was not fully for God. He did not want to sell his property/possessions. He loved his stuff too much. He did not want to die to himself and follow Christ. He did not want to take up his cross.

20. To whom did Jesus say, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he, too, is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost"?

Zaccheus, the tax collector (Luke 19:9,10)
